THE STORY

LOGLINE

An unsuspecting yet willing accomplice drives his childhood friend after a robbery to escape a bleak future, but when things turn deadly, he must confront where his loyalties lie.

SYNOPSIS

"Sanctuary" is a Neo-Western Coming-of-Age short proof-of-concept film that tells the story of two young boys, Johnny and Clint. They've escaped their abusive households and take refuge in an old, abandoned church. Things get especially bad when two bank robbers divert their path and head straight for the same church. We see the clash when these two moments collide, and explore the question - What do you do when your best friend is dying? Do you try to save them or do you honor their final request?

Director's Statement

"How can I take what I learned on my last project and one-up myself." This is the question I typically ask myself when embarking on a new film. "Sanctuary" was no different. Hot off the heels of my last short, 'Forever Red', I was excited to direct something different, something crazier, something to really challenge myself. I began to search for projects that would honor my style and push the boundaries well beyond what I'd previously been able to accomplish. During my search, I found myself becoming enamored by the coming-of-age genre.

The more I watched, the more embedded I became in this newfound fascination of the wit, chemistry, and nostalgia this amazing genre can create. I found myself going back and watching some of the classics, "Stand by Me", and "The Goonies," and exploring more lesser-known pieces such as "L.I.E" and "Mysterious Skin" and thoroughly enjoying newer pieces that paid homage to the classics such as "Stranger Things" and "IT". I began to gravitate towards telling a story that showed how past abuse/trauma/etc can affect not just the adult life of a childhood victim but how it can become a cycle manifesting itself differently across generations. I knew I wanted to use this film to speak to those who experience this and use this as the emotional core, the heart of this story.

We've assembled a truly amazing team, and I'm honored to be leading the creative direction of such a heartfelt story. We've come a long way since I first came across the original draft of "Sanctuary", but now in it's finished form, I can wholeheartedly say I have fulfilled my goal of crafting a film that tells a human story which far exceeds the ambition previously sought after by my previous work.

OUR STORY



The story behind the story? We are a team of East and West Coast independent filmmakers leveling up our production skills in a big way! On this short film, we had driving scenes, a car chase, fight scenes, prop guns, filming on location (which required permitting, hiring CHPs, and cast & crew travel and overnight accommodations), building a set and filming in studio, working with named actors, working with SAG actors, working with child actors - WHEW! It was a huge undertaking. If we had added animals, it would have been the whole chimichanga!


Why all the fuss? "Sanctuary" is more than a proof-of-concept. It is a proof-of-workflow. As filmmakers and future job-creators, we wanted to explore what it would take to make a feature film, soup to nuts. That way, when we produce the feature, we are prepared for duplicating the process. So, we approached this proof-of-concept short film like any other independent feature film: everyone was paid an acceptable reduced day rate (except for two college interns), we arranged for overnight accommodations and trailers while filming on location, hired an on-set teacher for our child actors - we even coordinated a build crew while filming on location! There was a lot learned, and we're eager to share both the film and our reflections on the process with you!

"Sanctuary" is the first shining example of the Owl Echo Entertainment Mission - creating stories that inspire audiences and impact lives, on and off camera. We are dedicated to exploring and implementing a new standard of Ethical Filmmaking.

Why "Sanctuary"?

So much of American cinema focuses on violence, but it is less frequent that such stories bring up discussions around the consequences of poor decisions. As conscientious storytellers, we don't just want to highlight the issues in our society. We want to be part of the conversation that introduces solutions.

"Sanctuary" the Short Film focuses on the themes of friendship and loyalty, but it also touches on the subject of abuse. The two young boys, Johnny and Clint, escape from their respective abusive home situations, and in their limited way, attempt to escape the generational trauma brought about by learned behavior. When they run away to an abandoned church, their journey further begs the question - how would their story change if the church were *not* abandoned? What would their story look like had they had a supportive mentor or community to run to for help?





The adult storyline focuses on DRIVER and GUNMAN after what appears to be a bank robbery that turns into a heated car chase. When things turn deadly, their story explores how and when to honor a friend's last request. Do you do what you feel is best for them, or do you do what they ask? How far would you go to honor a friend's dying wish?

Is this a Faith-based Film? We like to refer to it as faith-adjacent... While there is no statement of religious theme, there is a young character that asks, "Do you think there's a hell?" This is an important question lots of young people explore when faced with real world problems. While "Sanctuary" the Short Film does not attempt to answer this question in any religious way, it does allow the characters to explore their version of the answer as a coming-of-age film.

More that a Short Film: Through the process of making this proof-of-concept film, we also decided we wanted to share what we learned with other up-and-coming filmmakers so that we can all come together to continue to improve how we approach independent filmmaking. We hope our contributors find our film entertaining and our behind-the-scenes enlightening.

Why Now?

The story of "Sanctuary," the Short Film, is incredibly relevant to today's generation of young people who are struggling to overcome their own generational trauma while finding meaningful connection and their place in the world. While we do not intend for our characters to be a model for good behavior, we also fully recognize the way people struggle when they feel like they have no other choices. At the very least, we hope audiences walk away considering their options so they never have to feel as cornered as Johnny and Clint.

From the beginning - the biggest challenge wasn't driving, stunts, building a set, or even pursuing named actors. Our biggest challenge was treating this short film the same way we would a feature so that it would be scalable as a proof-of-concept. "Sanctuary" is a short film, but it is also a case study to see how we can resurrect independent filmmaking and make it into a financially sustainable business model.

Often the compromise to make a film profitable is to pull resources during production to the detriment of the crew. After the tragic shooting of Halyna Hutchins on the set of Alec Baldwin's Rust in 2021, we hope our example of preparation and set safety will help to encourage a new standard in ethical, fiscally sustainable filmmaking.







Ben Plassala as Young Clint




Rhys Jackson Becker as **Young Johnny**








Andrew J. Katers as **Driver / Johnny**








Cedric Benjamin as *Policeman*


Arthur Castellano, Cinematographer and Co-Producer

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






Eddie Conna, **Driving Stunt Coordinator**& **Gun Safety Specialist**






Victoria Vieira, *Art Director*
